Press Release

11/17/17 through 11/24/17

17-Nov-17 Deputies received a report of a stolen vehicle. The vehicle was parked in front of the CenturyTel building on November 16th and was discovered stolen on November 17th. The keys were left in the vehicle. The vehicle was later found in the Roggen area. Case is under investigation.

17-Nov-17 Deputies received a report of two Great Pyrenees being shot between November 16th and November 17th in the vicinity of CO RD 17 and CO RD FF. One of the dogs had to be euthanized due to the injuries; the other dog may have to have a limb amputated due to injuries. Case is under investigation.

19-Nov-17 Deputies were called to the 300 block of Weld in the Town of Otis to help Washington County Ambulance Service with a patient who had a knife and was threatening to hurt herself. The patient had dropped the knife before deputies arrived. The patient was transported to the hospital without incident.

20-Nov-17 Deputies responded to a vehicle rollover on Hwy 63 and CO RD 57. Colorado State Patrol took over the rollover.

20-Nov-17 Deputies received a report of a transient walking south on CO RD CC from Anton. Upon contacting the individual it was determined that he had not committed any crimes and was free to keep walking. Later in the day deputies were dispatched to another address with the same individual, the individual was trespassing. The individual was told he needed to keep moving. No further action was taken by the deputy.

20-Nov-17 Deputies received a report from an Akron resident about a possible fraud. The individual had accepted part-time employment from an internet company. In the course of the employment the resident made purchases at the direction of the employer, using his own credit cards, on the promise of reimbursement. The employer initially directed the victim to purchase computers and then directed the victim to purchase high dollar gift cards and provide the number and pin to the employer. The victim was not reimbursed and now is in debt to his creditors in the excess of \$60,000.00. Case is under investigation. Residents are urged to be extremely cautious in dealing with on line employers and their promises.

20-Nov-17 While in custody, Brandon March was arrested on a Larimer County Court warrant. March is being held on a \$100.00 bond.

20-Nov-17 Deputies responded to a suicidal party with a warrant. Robert Knapp was later arrested and transported to the Washington County Justice Center. He was later released on a \$50.00 bond.

21-Nov-17 Deputies received a report of two dogs running loose in the Town of Akron. The dogs were taken to the Akron Pound and the owner was given a verbal warning.

21-Nov-17 Deputies received a report of a street sign bent and twisted in the Town of Otis. Upon further investigation it was determined that between November 20th and November 21st an oversized vehicle had made a right turn from westbound Second Ave onto northbound Dade Ave, striking the stop sign and the street sign bending both signs and twisting the street sign around on the post. Case is under investigation.

22-Nov-17 Deputies responded to a possible assault victim walking down Hwy 34 at CO RD XX. Upon making contact with the individual it was determined that she had been assaulted. James Johnson was arrested for 3rd degree assault and transported to the Washington County Justice Center. He is being held pending advisement.

24-Nov-17 Deputies received a call about a possible criminal mischief near the Otis area. Upon further investigation deputies noted minor damage to a grain trailer and missing vehicle parts. A suspect has been identified and the case remains under investigation.
