08/30/19 through 09/06/19

August 30, 2019

Deputies were notified by Logan County that a camper that was possibly stolen from Logan County was in the Otis area. Deputies located the camper and spoke with the owner who showed proof of ownership for the camper. Deputies notified Logan County of their investigation.

Deputies were dispatched to a possible attempted burglary in the 600 block of Birch in the Town of Akron. Case is under investigation.

Deputies received a report from a Hillrose resident about a lost firearm that was lost in between Hillrose and Prewitt State Wildlife Area. Firearm was entered into the system as lost/stolen.

Deputies were dispatched to a welfare check of a family in the Town of Akron. Deputies met with the residents and everyone was fine.

August 31, 2019

Deputies took a report of an animal abuse in the 300 block of Birch. After further investigation, it was determined that nothing criminal had occurred.

September 1, 2019

Deputies were informed of a dog that was possibly injured located at Prewitt Reservoir. Deputies located the dog at the reservoir and released it to a party who took it to be medically treated.

Deputies were dispatched to a suicidal party in the Town of Akron. Deputies requested medical to check on the individual due to the level of intoxication. The party was later released to a sober family member.

Deputies were dispatched to a possible domestic violence at Mojos Inn. Luke Padula was later arrested and transported to the Washington County Justice Center on charges of harassment, child abuse-places at risk with no injury and domestic violence. Padula was later released on a PR Bond.

September 2, 2019

Deputies were dispatched to a possible trespass on CO RD 51. After investigation, deputies determined nothing criminal had occurred.

September 3, 2019

Deputies received a call from a Washington County resident about a state employee trespassing on his land. Deputies let the resident know what to do next time something like this happens.

Deputies were called about two dogs running at large by CHS. The dogs were located and returned to the owner, Paula Lefforge. Lefforge was given a verbal warning for dogs at large and to get her dogs licensed with the Town of Akron.

Deputies received a report of keys that were stolen at the Akron High School. Deputies were later notified that the keys had been found.

Deputies were dispatched to a suicidal party in the Town of Akron. The party was transported to a local hospital for evaluation.

Deputies were dispatched to a possible trespass on CO RD YY. Upon further investigation, deputies discovered that the dash of the pickup had been ripped apart. Case is under investigation.

September 4, 2019

Deputies received a report of Apple Air pods that were stolen at the Akron High School. Case is under investigation.

Deputies responded to a call of vandalism to road signs in the area of CO RD T and CO RD 39. Case is under investigation.

Deputies received a call about vandalism to the men's and women's bathroom at the roadside park in the Town of Akron. The men's bathroom had the window blocks broken out and the stall panel knocked out. The women's bathroom had a board that was covering the window blocks broken. Case is under investigation.

Deputies received a report of suspicious activity in the Town of Akron. Case was cleared due to lack of evidence.
