July 10, 2020

Deputies were dispatched to a semi-truck on fire on Hwy 34 at approximately CO RD V. The semi-truck was a complete loss and the driver was uninjured.

Deputies received a report of an identification fraud and attempted money fraud. The victim advised he had received a phone call from someone he believed to be the Social Security Administration telling him his social security number had been used illegally. Washington County Sheriff's Office is urging the public not to give out any personal identifying information over the phone to people claiming to be the Social Security Administration. The Social Security Administration will not call you to handle these kinds of matters.

Deputies received a report of a chicken that had been found in the 200 block of W 5<sup>th</sup> St in the Town of Akron. No one had reported a missing chicken. The chicken was later adopted.

July 11, 2020

Deputies responded to a vehicle on fire in the 300 block of Custer Ave in the Town of Akron. The cause of the fire appeared to be a mechanical issue.

Deputies responded to an address north of the Town of Akron in regards to telephone harassment. The parties involved were warned to leave each other alone and if the behavior continued they would be charged.

July 13, 2020

Deputies issued an abatement for overgrown weeds in the 500 block of Custer in the Town of Akron.

Deputies received a report of a dog at large at the Washington County Fairgrounds. The dog was taken to the pound and the owner, Rachel Cline later picked up the dog.

Deputies received a driving complaint with regard to a tractor-trailer west of Akron. Deputies found the tractor-trailer but could not find sufficient evidence to cite the driver involved.

Deputies received a report of a dog whining in the 900 block of W Sunset in the Town of Akron. The dog was checked and appeared to be in good health.

While patrolling the Town of Akron, deputies observed several stop signs and several vehicles that had what appeared to be blue vehicle chalk markings on them. Case is under investigation.

July 14, 2020

Deputies initiated a traffic stop for a traffic violation. Salvador Subia, who was the driver, presented a revoked driver's license. The vehicle he was driving had no license plates or insurance. Subia was issued a summons for driving under revocation, no number plates attached to the vehicle and operating a motor vehicle without insurance.

July 15, 2020

Deputies received a report of a head on collision on Hwy 34 near CO RD SS. The driver of one of the vehicles was pronounced dead on scene, and the other driver was transported to the hospital. Colorado State Patrol took over the scene.

July 16, 2020

Deputies were dispatched to a one vehicle accident on CO RD 39 and CO RD DD. When deputies arrived they observed one vehicle on the southeast side of CO RD 39 with damage to the front bumper of the vehicle. Deputies cited Cheyenne McGuire for failure to yield.
